The Imitative Russian. The Russian peasant is not an inventor. but he has a genius for imitating. He has only to be told to go and do so and so, and in time it will be done. He will in this manner become a blacksmith, a woodcarver, a copyist of painters, an engineer, or a lapidary, provided he is only given time enough. He will watch the next workman to him using his saw, chisel or file; then he will cautiously imitate him, doing a little at a time and nothing rashly. Next day he will show more skill until in a few weeks he becomes a sufficiently skillful workman to be intrusted with tasks requiring great judgment and even knowledge to execute. In the Graniloi Fabrik, in Ekaterinburg, for example, the visitor is astonished to find men not above the rank of peasant, and in all likelihood convicts under surveillance, executing the most beautiful engravings on beryl, amethysts, topaz and emeralds, or carving on jasper and porphyry vases with a skill which could not be exceeded, if equalled, in the great centres of

fine art workmen of Europe. Yet such intelligent laborers are-or were, at all events in Erman's day, fifty years ago-not paid more than ninety cents per month, with rations of a few pounds of black bread. Yet they are quite content with their lot and toil on to make fortunes for the rich mine owners, who live in great state in five mansions. Even the master workmen or overseeers are only paid some fifty-five or sixty dollars per annum, but they, like the ordinary laborers, have their perquisites in the unrecognized pilferings which they can manage to effect among the treasures they handle.

Boy Champion Wing Shot of the World. Capt. A. H. Bogardus Beaten by Fred. Erbir, of St. Joseph, Mo.

Captain A. H. Bogardus, the champion wing shot of the world, has at last met defeat. His conquerer is a boy named Fred Erb, jr., of St. Joseph, Mo. A match recently took place between Captain Bo gardus and Erb, at that place, for a purce of \$200 and fifty per cent. of the gate money; each to shoot at 100 birds from five traps. The traps were arranged in a sort of semi-circle, the marksmen not knowing from which trap the pigeon would be pulled. Universal interest was manifested and members of clubs of the Missouri Valley, the club in the north and southwest as well as hundreds of other sharpshooters were present. The wind was boisterous and cold before the shooting began, and when young Erb fired the last shot, dropping his twenty-third bird in succession, the thermometer was working down to zero, and a fearful gale swept over the grounds.

Capt. Bogardus opened the match, and when each had shot at fifty birds, the score stood Erb, 46; Bogardes, 43. When the last bird fell the score stood Erb, 93; Bogardus, 83. The St. Jo.
