#### THE PLATFORM ADOPTED.

A String of Platitudes, Evasions and Self-Glorification.

In the Chicago convention on Saturday afternoon Mr. Pierrepont, of New York,

from the resolution committee, reported as follows:

I need hardly say that in a committee composed of one from each state in the union, from each territory, and from the District of Columbia, there is a great diversity

of opinion about the question of the resolutions to be brought before the convention.

Early in the convention it became apparent that we would have a sufficient number of exciting topics to keep us active and awake, and we have endeavored to make the resolutions which we could not ourselves agree upon nothing that would tend to distract the harmony of this convention or awaken angry debate or cause long delay.

I have now the honor to present the resolutions which the committee have agreed upon:
