THE GREENBACK NOMINEE. Scratched a Presidential Candidate and You'll Find a Buckeye.

Gen. James B. Weaver Nominated for President by the Greenback-Labor Party.

E. J. Chambers, of Texas, for Vice President Chicago, June 11. - The Greenbacks nominated Congressman Weaver for president.

Chicago, June 11. - In the Greenback-Labor convention last night, after the nomination of Weaver, Campbell, Butler and Wolfe for the presidency, Congressman Yocum, of Pennsylvania, placed in nomination Hon. Hendrick B. Wright, of Pennsylvania.

Wm. A. Dale, who claimed to be a phenomenon, inasmuch as he was the only living Confederate private in the United States, nominated Thomas H. Murch, of Maine, but Murch promptly declined.

Wisconsin presented the name of Edward P. Allis, of that state.

At 3:25 p. m. it was voted that the convention proceed to ballot for a nominee for president of the United States.
