Gardeners' Notes.

The People says that a gentleman anxious to ascertain the effect of transplanting fruit trees in daylight and at night, removed ten cherry trees while in bloom, around the roots of each was a quantity of soil. It was noticed that those transplanted at night retained their blossoms and bore fruit, while the others failed to bear. The same result is stated to have followed the removal of other fruit-trees. Absence of the sun and the cool and damp atmosphere of the spring evening have a tendency to prevent the loss of vigor in growing plants and trees immediately after removal, which perhaps accounts for those thriving best that were transplanted

A remedy for plant lice upon the termi nal shoots of rose bushes, or similar hardy plants, said to work like a charm, is as follows: Take four ounces of quassia chips, and boil for ten minutes in a gallon of water. Take out the chips and add four ounces of soft soap, which should be dissolved in it as it cools. Stir well before using, and apply with a moderate sized paint brush, brushing upward. Ten minutes after, syringe the tree with clean water to wash off the dead insects and the preparation which would otherwise disfigure the rose tree.
