### OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENCE Progress the Order of the Day-Political-

Personal

The march of improvement is going on, and with it, step by step the Pennsylvania railroad is progressing. One of the latest of the new ideas in practical shape, to which the company gives its confidence and support is the "indicator," which, as its name signifies, is an invention by which is indicated something-what, we will try to explain. The indicator, to begin with, is a new invention ; it indicates time and it indicates distance. With it, if the experiment to which it is being subjected, proves it to be worth what is claimed for it the company will be enabled to ascertain to a fraction of a mile the distance made by a moving train in a given time, the portions of the road where fast and where slow time is made and lastly how long and where stops are made, the time of such stops and the time of starting, the whole to point to what the train men may be held to any accountability for. The indicator is now being experimented upon in the cabin cars of freight trains, those running with engines 188 and 253 being the Columbia "cabins" selected. A pair of wheels were taken from under both of places. these cabin cars and new wheels put in their places. An attachment is then made with the axle which, in its diameter and circumference of course, gives the key note to the working of the indicator, and which by reason of the important part assigned it in the working of the invention is necessarily smooth and of a select pattern. From the axle to the interior of the car runs a rod, which in turn connects with the machinery by which the many mysteries of the indicator are worked out. This machinery, enclosed in a case with a glass front, works with clock-like precisionpossibly it is clock machinery-and indexes to a certainty, with a lead pencil, attached to an arm rod, on blank paper the time made with, the distance accomplished. The paper used will probably have the stations of the road printed thereon and then the time may by taken from station to station. The invention proves to be a success and, if adopted on this road, it will be looked upon by train men as an intruder, as it will con fine them to the maximum and minimum speed laid down in the company's rules and will be a sure witness against them when they increase or decrease their orders. It is thought by some that the jarring of the train will have some effect on the indicator's working, but, we judge, this has been given due consideration. The Borough Budget.
