Confiscated Coin.

How \$1,250,000 in Gold Got into Circula-

It has been recently discovered in the mint bureau of the treasury department at Washington, that, after the breaking out of the late war, the New Orleans mint continued coinage for several weeks, and about \$1,250,000 of gold and silver, of different denominations, was coined from bullion on hand at the time the war broke out. This money, it is said, has never been accounted for officially, as all communication ceased when the war began. The proper entries were made upon the books of the mint, however, and these books were not long ago shipped to Wash-ington, and, in making certain compari-sons in the office of the director of the mint, the fact was discoved. There has in consequence of this unaccounted for amount of coin, been in circulation \$1,250,-000 in excess of the amounts specified from time to time. It is supposed that the money fell into the hands of the confederacy, and that all has been put into circulation.
