

THE MOUNT JOY MEETING.

A MONSTER DEMONSTRATION.

Unequaled Outside the City During the Present Campaign.

The Democratic torchlight parade and meeting in Mr. Howell's field last night was the finest political demonstration ever seen in that section of the county, and has not been equalled in the numbers in line and the prevailing enthusiasm anywhere in Lancaster county during the present campaign, except in this city.

An excursion train was run from this city, and by 6:45 p. m. an immense crowd had assembled in and about the Lancaster depot preparatory to the departure of the train.

The city clubs formed in line at the depot, and were marched to the place by music; a band being also assigned by the local management to the Eighth and Ninth ward clubs.

The parade was formed and moved off under the direction of the Chief Marshal Martin Hildebrand; Assistants: Philip Frank and J. B. Shelly; Aids: A. B. Culp, Ephraim Baker, Jacob Schrite, R. M. Robinson, John Baugh, Dr. Bowers, Daniel Hottel and others.

Besides nearly 700 men from Lancaster, the fine looking regiment companies of Columbia, who take the cake for excellent drill, turned out over 80; Ad. Dietrich

The Reading Railroad.

An Injunction Against the Receivers Asked for.

Philadelphia, Oct. 28.—The Fidelity Trust, insurance and safe deposit company trustees of consolidated mortgage bonds of Philadelphia and Reading railroad company filed a petition in the United States circuit court this morning asking for an injunction restraining the receivers of the Philadelphia and Reading road from appropriating bonds in their possession to the payment of interest on the general mortgage bonds of the company until certain specified sums shall be set aside in the sinking fund for the redemption of consolidated mortgage bonds which take precedence of the general mortgage loan.
