Water, says : The Duke of Sutherland has wisely instituted at Dunrobin Castle, Golspie, N. B., a museum, to which his tenants send anything rare or remarkable discovered on the property.

During the past week his secretary, Mr. Wright, has kindly informed me of a most marvelously interesting addition to the aquaria of the museum, namely, a very rare specimen of a gigantic sea worm, caught among some sea wrack by some of the duke's deep sea-line men, off Golspie.

This remarkable worm, when full-sized, is said to attain the length of from eighty to ninety feet; he is capable of shrinking himself up to a very much smaller length. He is as flat as a ribbon, and only five or six lines in width, of a brown violet color, and smooth and shining like varnished leather. Very little if anything is known of the habits of this monster worm, except that he lurks under stones and the hollow of rocks, where he coils himself up into a heap of knots, which he is incessantly loosening and tightening. He has, howthe power of undoing his knots and extending himself in a straight line. In this way he swims or rather glides through the water, propelling himself by means of fine ciliae. When he has found a new domicile suited to his purpose he coils himself up again into knots. His long dark-colored ribbonlike body is terminated by a head which is of a somewhat snake-like appearance, only there is no forked tongue nor teeth poisonous or otherwise.

The duke's specimen is apparently a small one between four and five feet long, but perhaps the creature has not uncoiled himself his whole length. His scientific name is the "Lineus Marinus." There is a beautiful figure of him in the proceedings of the Ray Society, 1873.

#### Assaulting the Bishop.

Extraordinary Scenesin an English Emsco

There is a worse scandal than a clergyman in prison, and that is a bishop in peril of bodily assault from a mob whom he has just tried to disperse with the Apostolic Benediction. This is what is reported to have happened to the bishop of Rochester, England, recently. The living of St. Paul's, Lorrimer-square, Walworth, is vacant, and the Bishop is tilling it up by an evangelical elergyman. This he announced to the congregation at the end of his sermon. "I tell you face to face," he said, "with my own lips, what will not surprise you, that whatever is illegal in the services here will have to be discon A great commotion instantly followed-loud hisses on one side and shouts of applause on the other, with the screams of women sounding shrilly over both. "On his way to the vicarage to disrobe," the report proceeds, "the bishop was the subject of a hostile demonstration, a great mob following him, hooting and yelling, and greeting him with many uncomplimentary remarks. At one point a rush was made, and but for the intion of the police his lore would have been assaulted. As he left the vicarage and drove away, the ill feeling of the congregation was again manifested, and his carriages was followed to the confines of the parish by a large crowd, who kept up a continuation of groans and hisses." This scene is the practical comment on the bishop's aphorism that "congregational independence is fatal to the liberties of the church,"

#### Kriss Kringle in Baltimore.

The mayor of Baltimore has within the past few days received no less than forty letters addressed in various ways to Santa Claus. The postoffice officials, when they receive a letter mailed to Kriss Kringle, put it in the mayor's box. The compliment, if it can be called such, is becoming rather anoying, and the mayor wishes it understood that he is not Kriss Kringle, or Santa Claus, and that he does not care to receive that worthy party's mail; and as much as the mayor would like to comply with the requests of the real children who write to him, it is but just to say that his purse would have to be very large and full for him to supply all their wants. He could not give to one, without giving to all, and hence he is obliged, in self defence to decline all. The letters nearly all ask for toys. Of course, among them can be found the attempt of grown boys, who write letters they suppose to be witty, but which in reality are very flat. Others send vulgar notes, but the majority are from innoceat confiding children, and some are childlike and amusing. They are variously addressed-many to "Santa Claus, at the post office;" others to Kriss Kringle North Pole; one or two to "Mr. Santa Claus Latrobe; more again to "Old Kriss, care of Mayor Latrobe;" and a few directed to the mayor himself. Some are stamped and a great many are not.
