Philadelphia Bulletin. In the insane department of the Bicetre hospital of Paris, a man died the other day who was known as the glass man (Chomme de verre.) He was one hundred and three years old, and he had been in the hospital since 1797. At the age of eighteen this poor fellow, who had been known as Jubissier before he had acquired the other epithet, had been badly injured in the head by a broken pane of heavy glass falling on it. The wound was a long time healing, and when it did heal, his reason had fled forever. At first he was idiotic, and then crazy; so that at ters. last he was placed in the Bicetre, where he remained for eighty-three years. His delusion was that he was made of glass, and for fear of breaking himself to pieces he kept motionless and speechless. Only once in the last twenty-four years did he speak, and that was to ask for tobacco During the siege of Paris, when the shells were bursting over the city, he became terribly agitated, and walked a little, muttering some meaningless words. After that he relapsed into the old siienee and immobility, which continued until his death last month at an age as great as that

of the American Republic. The case of Jubissier will, of course, be studied and reported upon by psychologists and scientific men generally, for there is no similar known case of insanity of the same kind or resulting from the same cause. As his reason was impaired by his skull being struck by a pane of glass, of course it is natural to infer that when all other ideas left him that one about glass remained, and possessed his whole being. One of the marvels of the case is that with this solitary idea, the creature should have lived for over 83 years, surviving perhaps two or three successive sets of attendants appointed to guard and protect him. One by one they passed away; but the man with the one idea that he was made of glass, and therefore must take special care of himself, lived tran quilty and perhaps blissfully to an age exceeding that of the average of the army of General Washington's body servants. If only the house servants of the present time had a like motive to preserve the glassware catrusted to them, it would be a great thing for the housekeepers, though a bad one for the glass makers and dealors. But the bottle washer has no more soul than the bottle; while Jubissier, faueying that his soul was encased in a glass structure, took the best possible care to preserve it, and he thus kept it on earth for over a century. Then somehow the cork slipped out or the fracture so long soul of poor old crazy Jubissier, the glass

No Frenchman so long-lived and free and relieves weakness of the stomach, from care as Jubissier, has ever been He was born in the reign of Louis XVI., but lost his reason before the revolution of 1789. To him, the Terror, ons reion, the Republic of 1848, the second Empire and its overthrow, were nothing his glass physical structure to care about war or politics, and even the siege and occupation of Paris had no terror to him except as the concussion caused by the bursting bombs might crack his poor glass skull. Thus free from all but one care, and that a selfish one, the glass man reached extraordinary longevity, and there is a bit of a lesson in and occupation of Paris had no terror to gevity, and there is a bit of a lesson in his life for men who have brains with the usual complement of ideas. The best and healthiest man or woman has a fragile body that could still be preserved to preserved to great age with a fraction of the care that Jubissier gave to his. So, too, the purest honor and the highest reputation may be preserved throughout a long life, if men would consider that these things are friable. If only the late William M. Tweed, of New York, had considered the constant danger to which life and character are exposed, he might have led a decenter and longer life, though he could not rival the glass man of Bicetre. It is not to be desired, however, that there should be many Jubissiers, living their centary on earth doing nothing as real workers or as political reformers. But there is hardly a man gambling in stocks, or trading in polities, or exhibiting himself as a patent re former, with a so-called independent but purchaseable journal to support him, who might not learn something from the history of Jubissier, the glass man of the Bicetre, who passed nearly a century in silence and idleness, and though he never did good to any one, certainly never did
