### The Tobacco Market.

Seed Leaf and Havana for the Week Ending Saturday, March 5, 10 a.m.

United States Tobacco Journal. While everything in our market regarding the '80 crops is as yet theory without practice, everything regarding the '79 crops is practice, with no theory at all about it. The latter crop continues to be brought up at figures that are staggering when the prices of the cigars that are to be made out of it are taken into consideration. To some of the large manufacturers in this city, the present state of the leaf market is proving an opportunity for money-making. They bought in a low market much in excess of their actual yearly needs, anticipating that the '89 crop would be a bad one. Whether their ideas regarding its condition have changed or the present high market is too seductive, is immaterial. The fact remains that they are quietly unloading their surplus stock, evidently realizing more profit out of it by this process than by manufacturing it into cigars

Fine wrappers of the '79 crops will surely remain in great demand during the year, irrespective of the looks and quality of the '80 crop. If the market continues brisk fine wrappers will soon become scarce. Substitutes will then have to be sought. As substitutes we name princi-pally Sumatra wrappers, which of late have met with so much favor among the manufacturers of fine cigars. The yield of this stock is so much in excess of that of fine seed wrappers, that the difference in price is trifling.

The '80 crops as being brought up now with increased avidity. The damp weather permitting better inspection, facilitates purchasing; those who have so far invested in them praise their purchases highly. They always do at this time of year. Those who have packed '80 Connecticut and New York state treat with contempt the boasts of those who have packed Pennsylvania, Ohio and Wisconsin. They pronounce the praises of the latter preposterous and ridiculous. When the time comes a decided and disinterested opinion will be given, as heretofore, by the United States Tobacco Journal.

As we go to press a sale of a packing of '80 state seed is reported. The parties to the transaction do not object of seeing their names published. Therefore the report ought to be true. Sales last week were as follows:

Pennsylvania-Crop '79: 1500 cases; of these over 800 were of low description; the price is reported as between 10 and 11 cente; fine running lots are quoted at 22 to 231 cents; fillers, 7 to 8 cents. Connecticut.—Crop '79; number of cases uncertain; computed at 250; no

particulars. State.-Crop '79: 100 cases fine rauuing Big Flats, 24 cents.

Crop '80; 250 eases, private terms. Havana.—The activity of the previous week continues. Sales run up to 900 bales. City manufacturers bought spiritedly, but in small quantities, '79 stock continues the main article, '80 is still awaiting a real opening. Prices unchanged.
