To predict the fate of the '80 Pennsylvania crop is impossible at this early date. The good portion of it is being bought at last year's high prices, while the poor portion sells at 3 to 10 cents. We cannot exactly see the policy of buying this poor portion at even such figures, when for the same money good '80 Ohio and Wisconsin, which is at least holeless, can be purchased. Packers seem to coincide with us in our view, as the influx of buyers in Ohio and Wisconsin last week was exceedingly heavy, and extensive purchases have been made in both states.

The sales of last were : Pennsylvania-Crop '79: 600 cases fine running, 224 cents ; medium running, 15 to 18 cents ; low, 111 to 121 cents fillers, 71 to 8 cents.

Connecticut—Crop'79: 250 cases, most-ly wrappers, 26 to 32 cents. Ohio-Crop '79 ; 400 cases ; reported at

111 cents.
