His Hale old Age Ascribed to Salt. Lorenzo A. Pickles, of Newfane, peddies trees throughout western New York He is 70 years old, and measures six feet and five inches in height. He has thir-teen sisters and eight brothers and he is the smallest of the entire family. One brother, who lives in Kentucky, is seven feet two and ond-half inches in height, and weighs 275 pounds, although he is spare in flesh. The littlest sister is six feet five and one-half inches. The family is scat tered, no two living in the same state.

Lorenzo Pickles has the appearance of man of 40. He never wears a coat, and goes without stockings winter and summer. He has two pupils in each eye. To distinguish objects close by, Mr. Pickles uses powerful magnifying glasses. He can read print and see things at a greater distance, without the aid of glasses, than it is possible for persons with the natural

He never tasted liquor of any kind in his life and never drinks water. Three small cups of tea a day, winter and sum-mer suffice to quench Mr. Pickles' thirst. He never eats fresh meat. His chief article of diet is salt pork, although he likes salt meats and fish He eats two tablespoonsful of salt every day and prefers sait to sugar in his tea. Pie and cake or sweetmeats of any kind he never tasted. He says he believes his hale and hearty condition is due mainly to the salt he uses. Mr. Pickles is a widower, but he has two daughters. One is 17 years old, the other 12. The oldest is 6 feet and half an inch tall. The youngest is 5 feet 9 inches, and their father says they are both still growing.

Bungs.

Some Facts About their Manufacture ab-What They are Made Of. The bung is a homely device, lacking

altogether the symmetry of an obelisk and having little even of the grace which corks often possess. But its uses are of a most important kind, and wherever liquids are contained in casks and barrels there must the bung be a so. It is almost impossible to estimate the

quantity of bungs made and used annually. but the number is well up in the millions. They are made of wood well seasoned, and are cut by machinery which is patented. In no country are so many bungs made as in the United States, for nowhere else are the woods which are used so plentiful. Cak, hickory, spruce and pine are among the varieties utilized, and the bung factories are scattered about the country in the neighborhoods where the wood used are found. By cutting the bungs before shipping the cost of transporting the waste material is saved. A great many bungs for beer casks are sent both to Germany and England from this country, not because they are better, but because they are cheaper than those made absoad. Bungs are cut by peculiar ingenious machinery, which works against the grain of the wood, tapering the bung with the In many cases the taper is made but slight in the cutting, and then the bung is submitted to a powerful compres-

sion to increase the taper. Bungs of ale and beer barrels are of a standard size, measuring 12 inches, while bungs for oil barrels are 2 inches. Whisky barrel bungs are used over and over again. Beer and oil barrel bungs are always picked out, because hammering the staves to start the bungs is sure to injure the coating of the barrels.
