Treasure Trove.

A collection of Rare Old Coins. At a public sale of old furniture in East Fallowfield township, Chester county, Mrs. Margaret Scott, wife of Humphry Scott, esq., bought an old book case for two dollars—she taking a fancy to the article on account of its great age and antique appearance. The book case was a companion piece to her "grandmother's clock." The book case is a curiosity and much amusement is afforded by its numerous drawers. The former owner thought he had mastered them all, they were in his possession for nearly thirty years; but Mrs. Scott's son found a secret spring that opened a drawer that had evidently not been opened for forty years, disclosing 147 old coins, 135 copper and 12 small silver pieces.

Some of the pieces are of little value, others are very old. The dates are legible, while others are well-preserved and to coin collectors are of great value and rare beauty. Among the most noted are Nos. 1 and 2—two pieces, date 1787; inscription, "Ephraim's Crown"; figure, a shield on the reverse, "Nova Caesarea"—a horse head and a plough.

No. 3—date, 1783; inscription, "Justitia Libertas"; figure, a wreath encircling the letters U. S.; reverse inscription, constellation figure, an eye and Sunburst, surrounded by 13 stars.

No. 4 and 5—two pieces, date 1787; inscription, Massachusetts, one-cent figure, an eagle with spread wings; reverse inscription, "Commonwealth"; figure, an Indian with a bow and arrow.

No. 6, date not legible; inscription, Washington, figure-head of Washington—Reverse, one cent head.

No. 7, date 1783, inscription "Washington and Independence," wreath of ears of corn; reverse "United States of America," figure a wreath surrounding the words one cent. This piece is a beautiful and perfect specimen of early coinage.

No. 8, date 1783, inscription "Liberty," figure a wreath of Washington surrounded by thirteen stars; reverse, United States of America, chain wreath surrounding the words one cent. This is also a perfect specimen.

No. 9, date 1774, inscription "Liberty," figure head of Washington; reverse, United States of America, wreath of wheat heads surrounding the words one cent. A good specimen.

No. 10, date 1790, inscription "Liberty," figure a wreath of Washington; reverse, "United States of America," wreath of wheat heads, one cent. A very good specimen.

No. 11, date 1795, a silver five-cent piece; inscription "Liberty" figure head of Washington surrounded by thirteen stars; reverse, "United States of America," spread eagle surrounded by a wreath. This is a well-preserved and very rare coin.
