Secretary Sherman's Fraud.

The result of the trial of the test case

between the sugar importers and the treasury

department shows conclusively that

it was Secretary Sherman, instead of our

merchants, who was guilty of fraud. The

United States circuit court, in a decision

which was rendered in the case of the

collector, who was the nominal defendant,

was compelled to declare that the government

had not presented a particle of evidence

in defense of its claim, and he therefore

decided the case in favor of the collector

without even submitting it to the jury.

The whole course of the department in

reference to the sugar duties has been an

outrage from the very beginning. After

being defeated at Baltimore, Secretary

Sherman tried to induce Congress to

change the law; and when this was re-

fused, he ordered the collectors to levy

upon the sugar importations to duties

which Congress had declined to impose.

These exactions were paid under protest,

and the importers brought suit for the re-

turn of the illegal collections. The first

of these suits brought by Messrs. Knowl-

ton & Co., against the collector was de-

layed in every possible way, until at last

the patience of the judge was exhausted,

and some months ago he appointed a day

for the trial. On the premisses that they

were not yet ready to show up the fraud,

the officials who acted at Sherman's dis-

cretion withdrew their defense to Knowl-

ton, and the collector was thus compelled

to refund to this house the money of which

they had been robbed.

The case of Messrs. S. & W. Welch, de-

clared yesterday, was held by Secretary

Sherman as the strongest of the multitude

depending on the issue, and all that the

resources of the United States could sup-

ply by the use of money and official in-

fluence was cast into the scale to vindicate

Secretary Sherman's infamous policy. And
