Leaf Tobacco.

The New York Market.

United States Tobacco Journal. Fourteen hundred cases of '80 New York state, 300 cases of '80 Pennsylvania, and 200 cases of '80 Connecticut seconds, are reported sold by one firm. The state and Penusylvania were bought by a prominent manufacturer, while the purchaser of the Connecticut seconds was a jobber. To none of these sales should any importance be attached. They were forced sales, as far as we are informed, to close out the packings of '80 tobaccos of the firm previous to the retirement from business of one of its members and his departure to Europe. Neither are these sales indicative of extraordinary qualities in the '80 state, Pennsylvania or Connecticut. For offerings of this kind and in this shape buyers can always be found, especially when the prices are low enough. That the prices were low we are assured by one who knows what figures were paid. Nevertheless, we repeat our assertion of two weeks ago, that transfers of packings of '80 crops will take place unusually soon; and judging from the scarcity of good old wrappers in the market at this comparatively early period, moneyed eigar manufacturers and obbers will keep a sharp look-out for all fine packings of '80 that may possibly be offered soon. To say that this is judicious

glaringly this was shown by the yield of the '79 crop. With but the shadow of an export business, our markets are bare of good tobac-cos; nothing but small quantities of '79 stocks are to be had. The '80 crop is talked of as being immensely larger in yield than the '79 crop. There is no authority to uphold it, however. This much is certain—that the past severe and prolonged winter has injured a great deal of tobacco. Therefore we advise our readers to use all possible caution in making early purchases of packings of '80 tobacco, and not allow themselves to be guided by reports or rumors regarding crops. If they see for themselves and abandon all notions regarding the section where the tobacco was grown, and if they buy subject to resampling at the time of accepting the goods, their early buying of packings will be at least legitimate commercial ven-

In '79 tobacco but a small business was done. Holders of '79 Pennsylvania are stiff; 221 to 28 cents for so-called fine running is the market figure. Even low goods of the '79 Pennsylvania crop are becoming very scarce. At the rate it is leaving the market, manufacturers and jobbers will have to fall back on the neglected balance of the '79 Connecticut. This stock can be bought low now, and speculators should give it attention. The entire sales of '79 tobaccos may be summed up as 1,100 cases, mostly Pennsylvania. Prices of all old stock remain as quoted in last week's edition. As we go to press a bona tide sale of 300 cases of '80 Wisconsin, Havana seed, is reported.

Important to Cigar Manufacturers. The following change of regulation in regard to the removal of eigar factories has just been promulgated by the commis-sioner of internal revenue: "It will not be necessary hereafter to apply to the commissioner for permission to remove cigar factories, including unstamped cigars Collectors are hereby authorized to grant permission to eigar manufacturers to remove their factories under existing rules and regulations, reporting promptly every such removal to the commissioner of internal revenue. Inasmuch as such a removal, if made without the written con sent of the makers of the bond of the eigar manufacturer, might relieve them from any liability for the payment of the tax on the cigars so removed, and from further liability at the new place of business, the utmost care will be taken by the collector to secure a strict compliance with the regulations."
