SEED LEAF HAVANA.

For the Week Ending Saturday, May 14

U. S. Tobacco Journal. There was very little stir in our market this week. The extraordinary heat and the absence of transient and city buyers caused the quietness. In '80 tobacco nothing was done. Connecticut seconds of that crop were lookad for by jobbers, but the few parcels that holders showed willingness to sell were held at from 11 to 11\frac{1}{2} \quad \text{"Inactive Kidneys and Urinary Organs cause the worst of diseases, and Hop Bitiers cause them all." ingness to sell were held at from 11 to 111 prevented their sale. The feeling of packers of all kinds of '80 tobacco is quite different from that which they evinced regarding the '79 crop. There exist no screwed-up expectations of getting immeuse figures, nor are there any fears of great losses. As a whole, the '80 crops were bought with more consideration and judgment than the '79, and with the stability of business in general the '80 investment will prove profitable if nothing unforeseen occurs to effect a change in it. Of all the holders of '80 crops, those who hold the Pennsylvania feel most secure. They are perfectly at ease, claiming that even if it ferments unsatisfactorily, the texture of the tobacco is such as to enable it to stand even a violent artificial sweat-

The stock of '79 tobacco on hand in this market is decreasing daily, and especially of yielding wrappers, good or bad, quite a scarcity exists already. The much neg-lected '79 Connecticut has come into slight prominence this week by a sale of about 350 cases of wrappers at about 22 to 25 cents. Outside of this we note sales of about 359 cases of '79 Pennsylvania, at previous figures, and several small lots of '79 Ohio, probably aggregating 200 cases, at an average of 10 cents.

Havana-Market remains active. The demand for good '79 and '80 is as strong as during the previous week. The uncertainty regarding the '81 crop is the cause. Prices firmer.

Less Havana Used. While the manufacture of cigars in the United States has increased enormously, the consumption of Havana tobacco, as compared with the number of cigars made, has fallen off greatly. Since 1877 there has been an increase in eigar production amounting to 500,000,000. In 1871 there were imported to this country 8,394,980 pounds of leaf and 9,759,355 pounds in 1880-only 1,346 375 pounds more than in the first named year, which shows conclusively that the importation of Havana tobacco has not kept pace with the manufacture of eigars.

Re-Sweating Tobacco Tobacco Leaf.

During the past few months suits have been brought in our state courts for infringement by several patentees of the processes of re-sweating leaf tobacco, and one of these suits has been decided in a We tern city. Other suits have recently been commenced against parties who are making use of processes for re-sweating leat tobacco, and as nearly everybody con nected with the manufacture of cigars or the selling of leaf tobacco, is compelled by the custom of the times to resweat in some form or other, it is vitally essential that those interested should ascertain what are their rights under the law at the earliest possible moment. Delay may involve them in court expenses and dam-

There have been so many patents taken out during the past fifteen years for resweating tobacco that it is a nice question to determine what is an infringement and what is common property, and it is time this matter were definitely settled. To aid in reaching a solution of the problem presented, a meeting is to be held in this city, on Wednesday evening, May 18. There should be a full attendance.

The Philadelphia Market. The only difficulty dealers have now is to obtain prime old stock for wrappers; the cry for such goods is daily, and the fortunate holders have the satisfaction of realizing a handsome profit. What eigar dealers are to do after awhile, is difficult to solve. Nearly all our first-class houses are busy buying and packing in Lancaster. The ruling price of seed leaf out of store is firm at full quotations. Gans' Report.
