Barns Burned-The Farmers' Work-the Outlook for Tobacco. Cedar Lane Correspondence

On Sunday morning a heavy rain storm passed over this section accompanied by sharp lightning and heavy thunder. Quite a number of trees were struck; Mr. Samuel Dague's barn was struck and burned to the ground. It is situated about two miles south of New Holland. He managed to save all the live stock, but all the other contents were consumedconsisting of 10 tons of hay, about 25 bushels of wheat, from 50 to 100 bushels of shelled corn, straw, reaper, threshing machine, corn sheller, &c. There is an insurance in the Lancaster County Mutual, but not sufficient to cover the loss. Mr. Dague appears to be very unfortunate in regard to fire. About four years ago his house was burned with all its contents, now the barn. An orchard surrounded the burnt barn and the green apples are roasted on the trees. whole orchard is killed by the heat. Mr. Dague himself received a severe shock from the stroke, knocking him from a chair on which he was seated, reading at the time. Mr. Israel Seldomridge's barn, on the farm adjoining Dague's, was also struck, but the only damage done it was splintering one gable end. Several trees on the same farm were also shattered to

same time. The farmers are all busy making hay. The crop in this section is light, and new hav therefore commands a good price. Wheat is beginning to color, but will not be fit to harvest for some time to come. Tobacco is starting finely One thing is very noticeable in the tobacco crop, viz where phosphate were used the crop is much further advanced than where manure alone was depended upon.
