The Celery-Crop. Now is the time to be thinking about getting in the celery-crop.

It is a very small root and can gather only a short supply of fertilizing substances...

A fast runner should be encouraged as much as a fast walker. While we cordially agree, therefore, with the proposition that an agricultural society, which makes the interest of all other interests, will sooner or later be ruined.

Even to admit that nothing but evil comes from a fast horse. One of the great sources of human admiration for the horse is that he is fleet and stronger than we.

We care little for the walking horse, except as a mere walker, in which he is certainly valuable, but it would be hard to get up any enthusiasm in a walking horse race.

We never even heard of a bot made on a walking horse, though one might say it would be as easy to get up bots on walkers as on trotters.

But it is not done, there is no admiration there; no enthusiasm, because there is nothing remarkable. But we measure the horse's value by the work he can do and his

fleetness of foot. These are the legitimate subjects for limitation and encouragement. One objection is that these points, which ought to be of very limited encouragement when there are so many other departments of agriculture to care for...
