## Philadelphia's Judge Briggs.

Judge Briggs, who on Wednesday de livered a charge acquitting two election officers of all blame in tempering with ballots, has sentenced William Cannon to six months' imprisonment and one hundred dollars fine for the crime of corruptly attempting to intimidate an elector. Cannon is an obscure person down in the First ward, a subordinate striker for Slack. He and Slack called on a shoemaker about election day and offered him some leather aprons and seventy-five cents to vote their ticket. The indictment against Slack was ignored, but Cannon, being a fellow of no consequence, unknown to the court and unable to retain influential counsel, was tried and convicted, and now is sternly sentenced, while men like Maher and Street, whose position only served to aggravate their crime, are honorable acquitted. This is what we call justice. "Society," says Judgo Briggs, "divides itself into classes for and against parties so charged, and whatever juries may do and whatever judges may do is sure to meet the criticism of one or the other of these parties." This is true. Society is at present divided into two classes, the ballot-box stuffers and political roughs and corruptionists and the decent citizens The former class is in very good spirits; it is the latter class that is criticising the proceedings of Judge Briggs' court.
