St. Swithin's Day. Next Friday, the 15th of July, will be St. Swithin's Day, about which there is an adage that if it rains or is fair upon that day there will be a continuous track of wet or dry weather for the forty days ensuing.

"St. Swithin's Day, if thou dost rain,
Forforty days it will remain;
St. Swithin's Day, if thou be fair,
For forty days 'twill rain nae mair." St. Swithin was Bishop of Winchester in 862, and was noted for his uprightness and humility. So far did he carry the latter quality that on his death bed he requested to be buried, not within the church, but outside in the church yard, where his grave might receive the eaves-droppings from the roof and be trodden by the feet of the passers-by. His lowly request was complied with and in this neglected spot his remains reposed for a hundred years, when a fit of indignation seized the clergy that the body of so pious a member of their order being allowed to occupy such a position. Accordingly on a certain fifteenth day of July they all assembled to convey St. Swithin's body with great pomp into the adjoining cathedral of Winchester. When they were about to commence the ceremony a heavy rain burst forth, and continued without intermission for the forty suc-ceeding days. The monks interpreted this tempest as a warning from heaven of the impious nature of their attempt to contravene the directions of St. Swithin, and instead of disturbing his remains they erected a chapel over them, at which many astounding miracles are said to have been performed. From this circumstance arose the popular belief of the prophetic character of the weather on St. Swithin's

The Sad Story Told by a Dying Lad. A sad little procession silently wended its way yesterday from within the sombre walls of the Eastern penitentiary bearing a coffin containing the remains of a 17-year-old lad, who died of consumption on Saturday after having completed half of a two years' sentence for larceny. At the time of the boy's arrest he gave an assumed name, and retained his incognito until the latter part of last week, when he felt the hand of death laid upon him. It. was then that he called one of the keepers to his bedside, and, after giving his right name, stated that he was an orphan and came from the South, where his relations, who are people of good connection, resided. He had come the city to make a living, and obtained employment on an ice cart, but hard work soon told on his frail constitution, and at last he had to cease laboring. But two alternatives remained for him, one of which was to go to the almshouse, and the other to prison. He preferred the life of a convict to that of a pauper, and he stole a set of harness, for which he was sentenced to two years' imprisonment.
