quantity manufactured from year to year and with advancing experience in the amalgamation of the juices of different varieties of grapes, the quality of the wine is much improved. According to the cen sus returns California alone produced las year 4,500,000 gallons, valued at \$6,600, 000, while the vintage of New York, New Jersey, Ohio and Missouri, last year nearly reached in the aggregate this total The entire quantity of wine imported inte the United States in 1880, from all cour tries, amounted to the aggregate of only 4.500,000 gallons, valued at \$6,000,000, howing a heavy reduction compared with many previous years. As a rule our domestic wines are much

purer than the imported, and a far greater degree of cleanliness is observed in their manufacture. A gentleman of this city, who was in the wine-producing districts of France some time ago, and saw the process of making clarets, says that the juice is still expressed by tramping with the naked fect, and that he saw some of these "trampers" leave the vats in which they were employed and cross a muddy road to get their dinner, without covering their feet, and on their return jumped into the again with the mud clinging to them ! We suppose they depended on the fermentation throwing off all impurities ; but it is not reassuring to think about.

The Culture of Water Cress.

There is nothing more easily taised than water cress. An open spring of water on any premises, which is allowed to spread and some of the land to become somewhat swampy, will without any more prepara-tion abundantly p.oduce water cress, if once introduced. In almost any neighbor-hood where there is an open spring, the border of which has not been disturbed, the plant can be grown. Gather them, cut them up into pieces so that each piece shall have a little root—no matter how small— and it will grow, and while giving a good supply, will spread from year to year if the ground is suitable : and there will be no and some of the land to become somewhat ground is suitable ; and there will be no further trouble about it.

We formerly raised it in our own garden. A very small spring ran through it, which had been undisturbed for many years, and it grew there spontaneously, giving us all that the family needed. When improvements were introduced it had to give away ; but even then it made its appearance every spring for several years. A few years ago we set plants around the border of the fish pond and they grew readily. We desired it to shade the water for the benefit of the fish; but

lo ! the fish ate all the tender sprouts, and what they left a pair of muskrats devoured root and brauch. All, therefore, that any one, who has

a spring upon his premises, has to do, is to introduce the plants along the edges and wherever there is a low place into which the water from the spring can spread and he will raise water cress according to the extent of the arrangements which nature provided. It is very appetizing for breakfast or tea, caten with a little salt only; and we are very sure that if it is once introduced it will never be abandoned, either for private consumption or for marketing.




