Summer Drinks.

EDS. COUNTRY GENTLEMAN-In extreme ly warm weather, refreshing beverages are very desirable, especially in the field where one is exposed to the scorching heat of the sun, and the whole system is perspiring with the heat and exercise. It is very imprudent to swallow great quantities of ice-cold drink when one is excessively warm; a few swallows taken slowly, wil quench the thirst far better than a whole gobletful swallowed without stopping. The very best of all drinks is new milk with very best of all Grinks is new milk with ice sufficient to cool it. It is not only cooling, but also nourishing. It is a most grateful beverage, not only in the field, but in the kitchen, and nursery as well as sick room, where it should always have a place. In fevers, it is the most delightful cordial that can be administered. A very nice beverage is made by taking two quarts of water, a tablespoonful of pulverized ginger, half a teacupful of strong vinegar and a half teacupful of molasses or maple sugar. Stir well, add a lump of ice the size of a quart bowl to keep it cool; put into a tin pail with a tight cover, and it is a very good field drink, and will keep cool half a

Another drink is made by taking a lemon or two, roll or squeeze till soft slice very thin, and put into a large bowl, and turn a pirt of boiling water over the slices. Let it stand till cool; then allow a quart of cold water to each lemon, and half a cupful of sugar; stir well and add a lump of ice to make it very cold. The acid of the lemon is very grateful to the mouth and stomach on a hot day. All iced drinks should be sipped slowly as they quench the thirst better, and do not give a chill, as if taken in large swallows and great quantities Still another drink suffering from poor health or languishing on a bed of sickness, take and great quantities Still another drink is prepared by taking two eggs, beat thoroughly till frothy, add half a teacupful of sugar, a teaspoonful of extract of vanilla and quart of milk; cool well with ice. It is very delicious and strengthening on a hot day. Another one is made by taking a teacupful of raspberry jam, stir it into three pints of water, strain it through a fine colander, and set in the ice chest till very cold; it is a very pleasant beverage. For hay pitchers, nothing excels good hot coffer, as it stimulates a little and seems to raise sufficient internal heat, so that perspiration flows freely, and keeps up the strength.

Refreshing drinks are a very great comfort during the summer heat, and give much nourishment to the system, as one is not very apt to feel hungry in the long summer days when the thermometer ranges from 93 to 100 in the shade. The more a person drinks the more he perspires; yet one cannot help craving some palatable beverage to cool the parched lips and mouth in the heat of summer. It is much better to take little at a time, and to drink more frequently, than to qualf a great quantity at a time. Frequent bathing of the face and head is a great preventive of thirst. Men are not half so liable to get overheated if they occasionally wipe off their faces with a wet towel or sponge. People to not take half the pains to protect themselves from the Health, Hope and Happiness Reheat of dog days that they do to guard against the inclemency of cold, and there is double the danger arising from overheating that there is from freezing. Snake Stories.

A dispatch from Ellenville, N.Y., states that on Saturday morning last as Jacob Uhl, a farmer of Prospect Hill, with his seven-year old boy, was loading his wagon with logs from a pile he had cut about a mile from his house, he heard an ominous hiss and rattle. Then a monster rattle-snake thrust his head out from between the logs, and Mr. Uhl says that he then saw what seemed to him hundreds of the reptiles in the wood pile. He gave a leap from the pile, and telling his frightened boy to drive the oxen out to the road and wait for him, he grasped a stick and began fighting the snakes, which seemed to come from every crack in the pile of logs and from the ledge behind.

For three hours he fought in a broiling sun. By the time the snakes were pretty well thinned out, and those that were left crawled slowly back to their den under the logs. When Mr. Uhl recovered from the exhaustation caused by his hard fight, he surveyed the field before him. There were, according to his story, 23 rattlesnakes, 13 black snakes, four pilots and several adders and other snakes, making 54 in all. One of the rattle s had 19 rattles, and another had the almost incredible number of 30. The others ranged from six to twelve or thirteen rattles apiece.

Mr. Uhl says that he found the fangs of several snakes in the tops of his boots, which were of thick cow hide. The only bite he received was from a big black snake on his left arm. The arm is swollen and somewhat painful, but the wound is not dangerous. Several years ago two hunters killed 107 snakes of different varieties in the same spet.

A York county man writes : On Friday last some of Mr. Frank Rohrbaugh's family, living near Shunk's Hill, were picking blackberries, they came across two large black snakes which they killed, and on opening them they discovered one hundred and five (105) young ones. They were speedily dispatched and with the two old ones made one hundred and seven (107) snakes killed by the family that day.
