In this republic, we're compelled To meet all kinds, you know !" -Margaret B. Harvey in Scribner. Edison at Paris. The Electric Exhibits with which He Intends to Astonish Europe.

The New York World of yesterda says: The last consignment of electri lamps and appliances from the Ediso electric light company for the international electrical exhibition, which is to begin at Paris next month were sent from this city yesterday in charge of Mr. Batchelor, Mr. Edison's first assistant. For the last two months boxes containing electric apparatus of all kinds have been shipped on every outgoing French steamer. Mr. Edison and Mr. Batchelor have been working for the last two weeks at the laboratory in Goerck street preparing this last shipment and perfecting a new dynamo machine of increased power. Last night, for the first time, Mr. Edison slept at home, for he has been working night and day at his laboratory. A number of his assistants, already in Paris, have completed all the rough work for the exposition which is to be made by his company. Machines have been set up and his station is well wired and only needs the presence of Mr. Batchelor, who is to superintend the final details, in order to be ready for the opening on the first day of August. Over 250 boxes have now been shipped by Mr. Edison, and it is expected that within a few days Mr. E. H. Johnson, one of Mr. Edison's superintendents, will leave for England in order to establish a model station

enue, in this city. Among the apparatus that Mr. Batchelor took with him yesterday to Paris are the following: "Electric lighting exhibit, 125 horse-power steam dynamo and several dynamos of less power, one 5 horse-power and several motors of less . power, 2,000 electric lamps, with specially prepared fixtures and complete appliances for regulating the current, for guarding against fire and for assuring absolute trustworthiness of light at all times; and a large number of machines for demonstrating every detail of a complete system of electric lighting. Mr. Edison has somewhat improved his lamp since last winter. Then a one horse power machine fed seven lamps, each of which burned for American four mouths. Now the same machine supplies nine lamps, each of which will burn for seven months. The size of the carbon has been reduced one-fifth without impairing the perfection of the filament This part of his exhibition of the uses of electricity, Mr. Edison thinks, will be particularly interesting to the Parisians, inasmuch as he has secured a license from the municipality of Paris to light up one section of the city, and he thinks that he at 7%. will be enabled from this exhibition to form a company for the lighting of the

In the other departments of the exhibition of the application of electricity Mr. Edison's skill will be well displayed. A complete telegraph system will be seen in his show rooms. The automatic (Morse), the automatic roman letter and the autographic systems will be fully demonstrated. Mr. Edison thinks the autographic system will at some future day astonish the world, Mr. Edison thinks the autographic system will at some future day astonish the world, when it can be further developed. At present this system will reproduce in Philadelphia a fac simile of the handwriting of a message written in this city. Besides these in the telegraphic department the duplex and quadruplex instruments now in common use here will be exhibited. A number of telephones are also included in the list, including the carbon telephone, the motograph telephone, the motograph musical telephone, the telephone recorder, which is the telephone and phonograph combined, and a multitude of telephones of different construction and principles.

Among the miscellaneous articles already in Paris or in charge of Mr. Batchelor are a pressure relay or a motograph relay in the telegraphic exhibit, a tassimeter, a carbon rl costat, a motograph battery, and exhibition of the application of the etheric force, a number of phonographs and megaphones, and a large number of electric lamps, showing the various stages of the development of the electric light from the first platinum lamp to the improved carbon light; practical illustrations of the use of electricity as a motive power, a complete system of underground street tubes, mains and feeders for the purpose of lighting up sections of cities, and an ore milling apparatus which will be operated by the use of the electric current. This is only a partial list and does not include many of the machines and appliances which were sent over before the work was begun.

In this city Mr. Edison is still pushing on his preparations for lighting the district bounded by Spruce and Wall streets and Nassau street and the East river. The wires have been put in nearly five hundred houses and the district will probably be lighted about the first of October. The work is all completed with the exception of the erection of the heavy engines in the central station. The contract nade with the subscribers is that the light shall cost the same amount as gas. The lighting of this district, Mr. Edison thinks, will reduce the cost of gas to \$1 per thousand cabic feet.
