"O! Long May It Wave"

An Incident Connected With Our National Song.

DEAR INTELLIGENCER: It was a great pleasure to me, as of course it was to hundreds of your other readers, to read Mr. Hensel's article on "O! Long May It Wave" in your issue of the 29th ult. which you reprint. The reading of the article recalls to my mind an incident connected with our national song that I will never forget.

It was during the Centennial that I was in Philadelphia and one evening attended the opera at the Academy of Music. There was there, too, but we were not in company of each other. Misses Cary and Kellogg were the principle singers, with several good male voices scattered through. The singing, which was very fine, as a matter of course, I saw in the faces of the Italian and in consequence the words were all "Greek" to me.

But near the close of the entertainment one of the singers, Cary or Kellogg (I can't remember which, as I was a "mere boy" then, and that's only been five years ago), came out, and in a clear, ringing voice, sang a clear enunciation of every syllable, and to me, faultless rendition of the whole, sang the Star Spangled Banner. What a thrill ran through that great house where every seat was occupied! How the people held their breaths, their eyes, enchained! Every man, woman and child, born beneath that banner, would have volunteered at that moment on a rack to defend it. And when she sang so beautifully, "O! The Star Spangled Banner in triumph shall wave o'er the land of the free and the home of the brave."

what an uproar, what an uprising, clapping of hands, stamping of feet, exclamations of pleasure, "yes" and "no" for a moment in the gaslight. That was the key to bring the sound from the American heart. And could that other key—could Francis S. Key have heard it—how it would have thrilled his poetic soul. A voice was with me and even he gave away and applauded with a will. I don't remember, but I think I waved my hat—we country folks are so demonstrative, and open our mouths so wide at theatres, you know. I saw in the Academy of Music never heard a more spontaneous, genuine burst of feeling.
