THE INFLAMMATION SUBSIDING.

DR. BLISS'S HOPEFUL OPINION.

THE CONDITION OF THE PATIENT.

EXECUTIVE MANSION, WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 19.—8:00 A. M.—Unofficial.

Information just received from the sick room is in substance that the president passed a comparatively comfortable night.

He was somewhat restless during the early part of the night, owing to pain in the affected glands of the neck.

This pain subsided later in the night, and afterwards the president rested easier.

His pulse is reported by the physicians this morning at about 102. No nausea nor vomiting occurred during the night.

A Good Night and Comfortable Morning.

EXECUTIVE MANSION, WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 19.—8:30 A. M.—Official.

The president slept much of the night and this morning is more comfortable than yesterday.

The swelling of the right parotid gland has not increased since yesterday afternoon, and is now free from pain.

Nutritive enemata are still given with success and liquid food has already this morning been swallowed and relished.

Pulse 100, temperature 98.4, respiration 17.

EXECUTIVE MANSION, WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—11 A. M.—Unofficial.

The president continues to do well. He partakes of nourishment more frequently and the quantity is being gradually increased.

The stomach offers no resistance and the attending surgeons express themselves as very much gratified with the outlook.

The inflammation of the right parotid gland is gradually subsiding.

DR. BLISS SPEAKS VERY ENCOURAGINGLY.

EXECUTIVE MANSION, WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 19.—12:10 P. M.—Dr. Bliss, who just came from the president's room, in reply to the question, "How is the patient?" said, "Oh, he is getting on splendidly."

"Does he experience any pain from the inflammation of the gland?"

"None to speak of."

"Has the swelling decreased any?"

"It has almost entirely subsided."

"Do you not apprehend any further annoyance from the parotid gland then?"

"No, sir."

"How is the pulse this morning, doctor?"

"From 100 to 104, beats comparatively firm."

"Is the temperature any higher?"

"No, the temperature and respiration are about normal."

"What nourishment has the patient taken to-day?"

"He has taken from 14 to 16 ounces of koumiss and milk gruel."

"Does he still relish the gruel?"

"Yes, he appears very fond of it."

"Do you expect to administer anything besides this?"

"We may give him something more later in the day."

"Will it be milk?"

"Oh, no, we cannot let him have skim milk yet."

"What do you think of the respiration?"

"Oh, that does not signify anything but extreme weakness."

EXECUTIVE MANSION—12:30 P. M.—Official.

The president's condition has perceptibly improved during the past 24 hours.

The parotid swelling is evidently diminishing, and it has not pained him since last night.

He is taking to-day an increased quantity of liquid food by mouth which is relished and produces no gastric irritation.

His pulse is now 106, temperature 98.8, respiration 17.

THE PENALTY OF DEATH.

Execution of a Murderer Whose Crime was a Very Brutal One.

BATAVIA, N. Y., Aug. 19.—The execution of Charles Stockley, for the murder of John Welker, a respectable and well-to-do farmer, living a few miles from this town, took place here to-day.

The crime was committed on April 29, when the prisoner, who was then only 21 years of age, fired three shots at him, the last one with fatal effect.

Stockley had been employed by Welker as a farm hand, and had sought through Welker's marriage with John's daughter, Lizzie, but was refused both by the girl and her parents, and the only motive for the crime was revenge.

He was promptly arrested and convicted in July last.

Since his conviction the prisoner has feigned insanity, and at times has acted like a maniac, tearing to shreds everything within his reach, and acted otherwise badly; he was last Tuesday examined by Dr. Gray, of the Utica asylum, and others, before a sheriff's jury, and was pronounced sane.

Since that time he has acted quietly.

His mother and his brother Richard had an affecting interview with him yesterday.

The murderer's last night on earth was spent quietly. He was again visited by his mother and his brother John, and not having been baptized heretofore he went through that ceremony, Rev. H. L. Everett, Episcopalian, and his spiritual adviser, performing the office and remaining with him to the last moment, 11:30 P. M., when Stockley retired and passed away at 5:10 this morning, when he was awakened but desired another hour's sleep. He rolled over and slept about that length of time. Then arising himself, he remarked that he felt well and proceeded to eat breakfast.
