U. S. Tobacco Journal. Our market is just now one vast flood of joy. Every one who has tobacco of any description feels twice his size. Even the dejected holders of '80 (Big Flats) State show a little glimmer of hope that their bottled up investments may, after all, be released some time or another without too cruel a loss. The discouraging news as to the '81 Kentucky and all cutting tobaccos, the rise in prices of old stock of this description, the suddenly increased export demands, the great certainty that the yield of the '81 seed leaf crop will be no larger than its predecessor, and last, the continuing great activity among cigar manufacturers, combine to give our market the present brilliant outlook. While conceding that some of the just cited fact have a justifiable bearing upon the market and its consequent enthusiasm, we cannot exactly see why any failure in the Kentucky crop should make the seed leaf market raise its figures. At the best it can only make a better channel for the outlet of the trashy seed leaf stock, of which there is no great quantity, and apparently will not be this month or next year. Certain it is, that we have no more seed leaf tobacco on hand than we want, and all indications are in favor of a rising market; but why every holder should all at once consider himself an embryo Crosus is hard to see. A Worm

Promptly Named by Dr. Rathvon.

FAIRFIELD, Aug. 25, 1881. MR. S. S. RATHVON-Denr Sir: I send by the stage driver a bottle containing a very curious worm. It was taken from a persimmon tree on the farm of D. L. Glackin, and we wish you to give a description of it in the weekly INTELLIGEN-

Yours truly, DAVID L. GLACKIN,

WILLIAM M. LEE. GENTLEMEN: Your "curious worm " was duly delivered to me as soon as it arrived in Lancaster city. It is the large of the "Great Walnut Moth" (Dryocampa regalis) or, as its European describer would have named it, the "Regal Walnut Moth.". It is frequently tound on the hickory and on the persimmon in localities where that tree abounds. When the larva is perfectly mature-which occurs from the middle of August to the middle of September-it burrows into the ground. instinctively going below the frost line, and there it is transformed into a large oval pupa, black or very dark brown in

color. It forms an earthen cavity, but spin; no cocoon; and there it hibernates during the winter, and its next evolution is a large and splendid moth at some period in the month of June in the following year, according to the meteorological condition of the weather. The colors of the moth are ashen, yellow and reddish brown. It is by no means a rare insect, but is none the less curious. The worm is associated with the earlier recollections of my boyhood. More than sixty years ago, in company with other boys, we made a premature raid on a walnut tree, and while we were engaged "hulling" the walnuts a very large specimen of this larga fell from the tree in our midst and caused a precipitate stampede. It is very formidable looking, but is entirely harmless. Its formidable actions are all a sham and it can be handled with perfect impunity. It is found in almost every state of the
