For the Week Ending Saturday, September 10, 7 A. M. U. S. Tobacco Journal.

If, notwithstanding the fierce heat of the week and the suspension of business on Thursday, the sales of the week sum up 3,500 cases, it is undeniable testimony to the continuation of the excitable state of the market.

When once the Pennsylvania is thoroughly picked, the tobacco market will be left to play an important role in the market. Of Wisconsin Havana seed little is in the market, and it finds buyers almost as soon as offered.

Export was dull. Who cares to sell for export when the imagination turns fillers into wrappers? The sales of the week are as follows:

From our investigations we are inclined to estimate the total leaf product of 1881, about as follows:

Total.....130,000 It can hardly exceed 150,000 cases.

The past fiscal year we consumed 196,000 cases; the selling prospect of old and new is therefore somewhat gloomy.

AN ORDINANCE.

To provide against injuries to the roadway, in the streets and alleys of the City of Lancaster, from the excavation and digging of excavations and diggings therein.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Select and Common Councils of the City of Lancaster, that from and after the passage of this ordinance no person or persons whatsoever shall dig up or excavate the roadway in any of the streets or alleys of the City of Lancaster, for laying water, gas or sewer pipes, or making connections with or repairs to the same, or for any other purpose whatsoever, without the written consent of the Mayor, or so long from the Mayor of said City.

Section 2. If any person or persons digging or excavating in any of the said streets or alleys, by virtue of any such permit, shall be guilty of neglect or default in the manner required by Section 1, the Street Commissioner shall give notice to the person or persons at whose instance the excavation or digging was made, and the expenses incurred, together with the penalty of twenty per cent, shall be recoverable, in an action of debt, at the suit of the City of Lancaster, as debts of the amount and now recoverable.

Section 3. That in all cases of contracts entered into by any of the persons or persons, for work which will require necessary any excavation or digging in the roadway, or in the streets or alleys of said City, the contractor shall be bound by recognition to repair said roadway as required by contract, or ordinance, and no final estimate for any such work shall be approved by the Street Commissioner until the contractor shall have produced a certificate from the Street Commissioner that Section 2 has been fully complied with.

Section 4. That any person or persons digging up the roadway, in any of the streets or alleys of said City, without the written consent of the Mayor, or so long from the Mayor of said City, shall be liable in an action of debt, in the name of the City of Lancaster, for the amount and now recoverable.

Section 5. That in all cases of contracts entered into by any of the persons or persons, for work which will require necessary any excavation or digging in the roadway, or in the streets or alleys of said City, the contractor shall be bound by recognition to repair said roadway as required by contract, or ordinance, and no final estimate for any such work shall be approved by the Street Commissioner until the contractor shall have produced a certificate from the Street Commissioner that Section 2 has been fully complied with.
