Duty Deferred.

Important Work Postponed to Next Year. Harrisburg Patriot. It is a matter of sincere regret that the most important business before the convention, the amended rules for the better organization of the Democratic party in Pennsylvania, was defeated. The consideration of the rules was postponed until the nomination was made, and in the confusion that attends the last hours of conventions they were not permitted to fall. Some delegates opposed the rules for no better reason than that they had no share in their initiation. The most effective arguments against them was that they are a departure from time-honored usages of the party. An argument that never fails when brought into requisition to sustain an abuse. When properly understood there is not one Democrat in ten thousand in the state who will oppose these rules. They provide first for the permanent organization of the state committee. Now when state conventions occur in the latter part of September, leaving little more than a month for the campaign, it is impossible for the chairman of the committee to perform any efficient service. In view of this the rules provide for a permanent organization in place of the present loose confederation. The state committee to be composed of the chairman of the county committees, which is an obvious reform. This rule in its construction was defective in not giving Philadelphia the representation in the state committee to which that city is entitled. It can be amended so to remove cause of complaint on its score. Another reform is the proposed abolition of senatorial delegates. In place of this "time-honored usage" the rules provide that there shall be two delegates for each representative in the state legislature. The amended rules contain four hundred members, not too many to give full expression to the voice of the Democracy of this great state. These and other proposed reforms cannot fail to meet general approval when their merits are brought before the next state convention.
