The Insurance Journals on Governor Hoyt, N. Y. (Insurance) Chronicle. At last Governor Hoyt, of Pennsylvania, has notified the insurance commissioner that he will sign no more charters for cooperative insurance companies unless compelled by the courts. No more! Well, seeing that in the past eight months he has signed 250 such—knowing in every case that the purpose was to form a pool for betting on moribund lives—it is about time to say "no more." The honest people-if there be any-ought when next Governor Hoyt appeals for their suffrages to say to him. "No more."

A Recent Discovery. Weekly Underwriter.

The governor of Pennsylvania has announced his determination to grant no more charters to graveyard life insurance companies, unless he is compelled to do so by the courts. He seems to have just discovered that they are not conducting the business as the law contemplates. Having granted charters to some two hundred of them within a year, and permitted the use of his name as a reference by at least one of them, the governor's present action seems a little ludicrous. That these companies were not doing a business contemplated by the law or creditable to the state, has been notorious for nearly a year and has formed the theme of charges by judges to grand juries. Yet while the courts were seeking to have them indicted and the newspapers were publishing daily accounts of their villainy, the governor went on chartering companies at the rate of four a week. We trust it will not take him so long to find out the character of the new form of insurance gambling which other states have refused to sanction, that of marriage insurance. it is not so dangerous to life as the other, but is just as demoralizing a swindle in other ways.

LANCASTER TOBACCO MATTERS. The Market Firm and Reasonably Active.

There is not much to be said about our local market. A good many buyers are on hand, and they traverse the county in many directions and manage to buy a good many lots of good tobacco. But the boom "that prevailed a few weeks ago is at an end for the present and will not return until after the crop shall have been stripped. Growers profess to believe they have very superior leaf and demand big prices Most buyers prefer to wait awhile and look at the leaf after it shall be cured. Thus far all accounts agree that it is curing finely-the only complaint of the farmer being that the crop is too short, while the buyer declares the prices asked are too high.

Of old tobacco there was sold in Lancaster during the past week not less than 1,000 cases, perhaps more—the prices be ing private.
