WEATHER INDICATIONS. WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 15.—For the Middle Atlantic states, cloudy weather, and rain, westerly winds, lower barometer, higher temperature.

Afternoon Telegrams Condensed. Leos & Holt's steam mill at Leipsville, near Chester, burned to-day. Loss \$45,000, insurance \$21,000.

Immense damage is reported to have been caused in England by the recent hurricane. The Shadow and Madge, fast yachts, started on their 30-mile race from Newport at 11 o'clock this morning.

At 1 p. m. to-day the secretary of the treasury had received four millions of 3 per cent. bonds for redemption under his recent decision.

James McHenry to-day secured an injunction restraining Hugh J. Jewett, president of the Erie railway, from voting on C. & I. C. stock held by the company, but claimed by McHenry.

The steamer George Leary, from Washington for Yorktown, is ashore on York Spit.

The Senate will take a recess from Monday till Friday to attend the Yorktown centennial.

More Land Leasers Arrested. NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—A Dublin special to the Telegram says Mr. James J. O'Keefe, member of the Parliament, was arrested at the Imperial hotel at nine o'clock this morning.

Mr. Arthur O'Connor, member of Parliament, has not yet been arrested, although Superintendent Mallon has a warrant against him. It is supposed that he has escaped from the country.

Patrick Egan telegraphs from Paris to Chief Secretary Foster that a conspiracy exists among the English soldiers in Limerick to fire on the Irish population, with out orders, at the earliest opportunity, and that the British government is aware of said conspiracy.
