TOBACCO MARKET.

SEED LEAF AND HAVANA.

For the Week Ending Saturday, November 6, 1881.

United States Tobacco Journal.

It has become very quiet in our market and very few are the transactions made.

In the opinion of holders of all grades of '80 tobacco outside of the unfortunate New York State Big Flats, the fate of the '80 crop is irrevocably settled.

"They will have to try what we have left at our figures," is the sentiment that prevails there.

The present quietude does not give them any uneasiness; what troubles them is the '81 crop. Most of them are waiting for farmers to put lower figures on their crops, claiming such to be a necessity before they invest.

Those who have already invested in '81 crops are confident that prices will rather be higher than lower; growers who see their neighbors realizing large figures for their crops can only be moved to accept less by some extraordinary turn of the state of the market.

No such extraordinary event is possible for a long time to come. The cigar trade is solid now; it may slacken in activity for a short while, but will resume again.

There are no speculative motives worth speaking of in these enormous prices of cigars; actual demand by the consumer has brought about the great business of the past nine months, and actual demand will keep the cigar manufacturing industry equally busy for many months to come.

That seed leaf tobacco of the '81 crop will not go as high, though, is also certain. Sumatra is, as we have said in many of our former reviews, putting a check on the demands of the growers. And it is well that such is the case; with the bright prospect before us there is no telling what height the seed leaf wrappers would rise, if it were not for the rapidly growing importation of these Sumatra wrappers.

It is, therefore, reasonable to say that while there exists nothing at present that would influence a fall in prices of '81 tobacco, no further rise in prices for that crop will take place as long as it is in the hands of the growers.

The business of the week we specify as follows:

Pennsylvania—Crop '80: 720 cases, fine running, 2 1/2 cents; medium, 16 to 18 cents; low, 14 to 15 cents.

Connecticut—Crop '80: 350 cases; wrappers, 20 to 45 cents.

New York State—Crop '80: 200 cases, P. L.

Ohio—Crop '80: 450 cases; 4 1/2 cents for fillers; running, 8 to 12 cents.

Wisconsin—Crop '80: 100 cases, p. l.

Havana remains active; sales 700 bales, mostly '80 stock. Prices firm.

Glean Report.

Sales of seed leaf tobacco reported by J. S. Gans' Son & Co., tobacco brokers, No. 121 Water street, New York, for week ending Nov. 7, 1881: 450 cases, 1880 Pennsylvania, 12 1/2 lbs.; 300 cases, 1880 New England, wrappers, 18 1/2 lbs.; 200 cases, 1880 Ohio, 4 1/2 lbs.; 150 cases state, p. l.; 100 cases sundries, 60 lbs.; total, 1,300 cases; market very dull.

Sales of Seed Leaf in October.

October was a busy month in the seed market of this city, the sales amounting to 17,000 cases. Only in June and September were the sales larger than in the past months of the opening of the present year.

There have been heavy transfers of New England, Pennsylvania and New York State leaf, those of the first named section exceeding all others severally considered, though closely followed by those of Pennsylvania. Prices have continued steadily up to this date there is no change in quotations.

Operations in the country were prosecuted throughout the month, but only with a mere shadow of the vigor observable in September. Flying visits were made to all the producing districts of several producing States, but the quantity of 1881 tobacco purchased bore but a slight resemblance to that secured the previous month. Purchases made in the country from this time forward are likely to be affected in the regular course of business, instead of in the hurried way in which they were made when the buying season opened.

The total sales for the twelve months of 1880 were 97,857 cases, and in the ten months elapsed of 1881 the sales have been 120,964 cases. With this aggregate already, it will be matter for surprise if the end of the year does not show a grand total of 150,000 cases sold.
