Seasonable Hints.

Something About House-Cleaning. Those housewives whose house-cleaning has been kept in abeyance, waiting for the last fly of summer to come and go, will doubtless rejoice that the frosts have come at last, though they demolish the little remnant of floral brightness left in our gardens, and metamorphose, as by the hand of magic, the cheerful summer land-scape into sombre autumn scenes. I like to have as much as possible of this branch of household labor accomplished in the spring, particularly the more tedious portions, like painting, whitewashing or papering. Then the days, instead of growing shorter and colder, are continually gaining in balmy airs and pleasant sunshine, and if things are not exactly "shipshape" within a certain limit of time, it does not matter so much. Sometimes. however, unless one has screens that effectually exclude the troublesome fly, these things, or some of them, have to be gone over again in the fall; or if not, there is still always enough to demand our time and thought to get our houses in order and well settled for the winter.

There are certain portions of housecleaning which it is more desirable to do in the fall. Among these are the fillings of beds and the taking up and putting down of carpets, while straw is dry and sweet; besides, with those carpets not in common u: e we thus make sure of doing away with moths and other carpet-eating creatures that might otherwise do much damage. Kitchen walls that require whitewashing should first be brushed very thoroughly with a stiff broom, to get off as much as possible of the old whitea not too strong suds may be used, but it must not be used too hot; scarcely more than lukewarm. If large, soft cloths are used (old flannel is best), and one is provided with convenient scaffolding to stand upon, and which is also easy to move about from place to place, she can go over the walls of a room in a very short time, though not always without an uncomfort able after-reminder in lame shoulders and

Those who have papering to do will find it to their advantage to make their paste of starch instead of flour. It should not be too stiff, nor must it be used till cold. "But it costs more," says one. It does, perhaps, a few cents; but it will nevertheless pay in the better appearance of your room, which will be free from those spots and discolortions often caused by the paste striking through and starting the colors, which are, when they occur, so fatal to the beauty of the papered walls.

Graveyard Insurance.

The Attorney General of the State About to Declare War.

The attorney general will ask the court of Dauphin county to issue writs of quo warranto for the dissolution of several insurance companies which have been doing business on the graveyard plan. One of these companies is the State Capital Mu-tual Aid association of Harrisburg, which has issued policies representing over \$15,-000,000 since its incorporation last November. The attorney general claims that these companies have repeatedly violated the provisions of the law under which they were created. Should the charters o these companies be forfeited similar action will, doubtless, be taken with regard to the nearly two hundred companies of this character in the state. The following are the ones to be attacked to morrow: State Capital Mutual Aid association, of Harrisburg ; Prudential Mutual Aid, of Harrisburg; Southern Pennsylvania Security, of Hanover, York county; Steelton Mutual Relief association, of Steelton.
