The Fontaine Engine a Failure. The wonderful Fontaine locomotive, for which great results were promised, and which was to have been given a trial of speed shortly on the New York division of the Pennsylvania railroad, has been suddenly sent back to the shops at Paterson, N. J., where it was constructed. The engine was brought to Altoona for preliminary work, where its peculiar construction of upper and lower driving wheels was carefully examined by the officers of the railroad company, and afterwards given a trial. This trial was not satisfactory to locomotive experts. They said that the damage to the tracks was greater than the compensation in expected economy in time. An officer of the company says that if the engine was given a straight track and one car it could undoubtedly make good time, but if tried under the same circumstances as engines on this road are the results would be very unsatisfactory. "Now, for instance," he said, "we take an engine of the kind known as 'long legged No. 10.' hitch on 10,' hitch on ten cars and start her off. Away she goes, swing-ing around curves and climbing mountain sides, and giving the speed that the builder calculated in his model. I doubt if the Fontaine engine could make any kind of time up a mountain side with one car, and I should feel considerably alarmed in a swing around a curve behind the new machine. You can rest assured that such a style of engine will never be adopted on this road, and I do not think it will be wanted in the West, for it could not run against the heavy winds they have on roads out there.'

Mr. Joseph Neal, of Pittsburgh, claims that the engine is an infringement upon a patent of his, and has instructed his agent in Philadelphia, Mr. Marcus F. Richardson, to proceed against the owners. Mr. Neal says that the engine is his patent precisely with the exception of applying the power at a different angle. He built a model in 1864 and took it to Philadelphia, where be interested in it a Mr. Richardson, who was to have half of the profits realized. It was built to propel street cars and the principle was so arranged as to increase the power and traction of the actuating force rather than the speed. But the patent obtained covered the right to use wheels of varied sise, so that high speed could be obtained if desired. "Unfortunately," says Mr. Neal, "railroaders and others who were shown the machine failed to see its good points, and the building of others was abandoned."

### Joe's Leg.

Not far from Fayette City, are two mining villages, named severally "Pull it" and "Stretch it." Between these two places lives Joe Davis, who was so unfortunate a few months ago as to have his leg amputated on account of injury received in the mine. After the operation, his leg amputated, was buried on the hillside just in front of the door of the dwelling, but the spot was unknown to Joe. In course of time the rains descended and the floods came and so beat on the burial spot of Joe's leg that the box became visible to the naked eye, and attracted more especially the attention of Joe. He inquired over and over again as he became able to hobble about, what was the meaning of that peculiarly shaped box tumbling down the hillside. The secret was finally let out to him. He had it interred again on the roadside and a fence erected around the spot. Travelers' inquisitive questions wearied him, and he now has the inscription ' Joe's Leg'' painted on the fence. ttonorable Mention.
