The Adelaide silk mills, a branch of the Phoenix manufactoring company, of Paterson, N. J., was formally opened in Allentown yesterday. Upward of one hundred gentlemen and ladies from New York and Paterson, as well as a considerable number from Philadelphia and other parts of the state, joined with about two thousand of the leading citizens of Allentown in the dedicatory ceremonies. Among the prominent guests were Hon. G. A. Hobart, of Pat terson; Hon. John Hill, of Boonton, N. J.; John Cook, vice president of the Danforth locomotive works of Paterson; John Ryle, of Paterson, the pioneer silk manufacturer of that city; Charles 1. Cornish, William Strain, C. Lambert, Stephen Van Winkle, James Booth and Roland Johnson, of New York, the latter being the oldest silk dealer in the city; B. K. Jamison and wife, John Lucas and wife and W. W. Kurtz, of Philadelphia; J. Lowrie Bell, William Lorenz, Levi Line and C. G. Hancock, of the Philadelphia & Reading railroad management; Judge Hagenman of Reading, and James Boyd, of Norristown. An inspection of the mill was first in order. It is of brick, four stories high, and 275 feet long by 50 feet broad.

The first, second and third floors are devoted to the preparation and spinning of silk, and the fourth floor is to be used as the weaving room. In this room operations on plain dress silks and ribbons will be commenced at the beginning of next year, and when the works are in full operation employment will be afforded to 600 hands. At present about 250 girls and boys are given employment. Skilled spinners and reelers can make about \$5 a week, and weavers can earn considerably more. A substantial collation succeeded the inspection, and following this speeches were made by Mayor Martin, of Allentown; Albert Tilt, president of the Adelaide mills company, and several others. Mr. Tilt gave some interesting figures on the silk industry in this country. The value of silk goods(finished) produced in the United Statee was as follows for the years indicated: 1850 to 1860,\$11,000,000 1870, \$12,000,000; 1874, \$16,000,000 \$21,000,000; 1879, \$30,000,000 \$35,000,000. The percentage of silk goods made in the United States to the entire consumption here was as follows: In 1860, 13 per cent.; 1870, 23 per cent.; 1874, 24 per cent.; 1876, 35 per cent.; 1880, 39 per cent. The number of hands employed increased from 1,600 males and 3,000 females in 1860, to 9,000 males, 18,000 females and 5,000 youths in 1880. Out of a population of 51,000 in Paterson, 15,000 now find employment in silk mills of that city, and he prophesied a similar showing for Allentown a few years
