SEED LEAF AND HAVANA.

Business still remains stagnant; if it wasn't for the prospects of a lively trade after January next leaf would fall in value rapidly As it is, holders are keeping the proverbial "stiff upper lip," and already begin to count their chickens in the unhatched '81 crop. It is absolutely impos-sible to speak of the intrinsic merits of the various crops; those who have bought claim to have only the finest; those who have not as yet invested and see no chance of buying at lower figures, predict the most disastrous consequences. We cannot see the least danger to any of the investments of '81 tobaccos, unless manufacturers next year succeed in inventing a process by which they can make eigars out of leather

shavings or '80 New York State Big Flats. The business of the week ran as follows: Pennsylvania-Crop '80: 1,000 cases, fillers low, 6 cents, running as high as 23 cents; wrappers, 35 to 45 cents. Connecticut-Crop '80: 450 cases; 14, 16, 18 and 24 cents for running.

New York State-100 cases ; p. t. Wisconsin-75 cases; p. t. Ohio-100 cases; 61 to 111 cents. Havana-Market moderately active ; sales 600 bales, mostly '80; prices unchanged.
