SEED LEAF AND HAVANA. For the Week Ending Saturday, December 3, 10 a.m.

U. S. Tobacco Journal. A slight improvement in the trade was noticeable last week, the presence of a few of the larger city manufacturers in the market and a few, though limited, sales to them was taken as a significance that the stock with the larger manufacturers in general is on the decline, and that soon they would have to invest in leaf to such an extent as will speedily clear the market of the '80 stocks. Certain it is that this lethargic state of our market will not last long. From the statement of the tax collection in the Third district of New York, in which the largest factories are situated, as given in another column, it will be seen that last month, which was expected to be the forerunner of a very quiet period, was in point of activity equal to its predecessor. There are no indications of any abatement, and though the coming purchases in the market may not be as extensive in special cases, the aggregate will no doubt be very great and likely to make old tobacco a scarcity before the new is fit to work. As to the new crop, everybody seems to have made up his mind that Connecticut, New York state and Western crops will be of a very acceptable nature, while Pennsylvania i still clouded in mystery and dark ness. Those who have not as yet invested but would like to notwithstanding this mystery and darkness, provided the farmers agree to come down in prices, pro-nounce the crop an unredeemable failure others, also, who have already bought some of this crop triflingly, and greatly of other crops, are equally loud in their condemnation of this crop. One of the firms in this city belonging to the latter class has even gone so far as to employ a broker to offer their purchases of '81 Pennsylva-
