The market is full of rumors of impending new failures in the manufacturing line, and there is little doubt but that these rumors will to some extent be veritied in the near future. We hold that to any address. such events can in no way reflect upon the soundness of the cigar manufacturing in-terests in general. The unprecendented activity in the trade was not of a speculative character, but was brought about by a genuine demand from the consuming pub lie. Those of the manufacturers who have lately failed and will probably fail within the next few months, failed, and fail for every other good reason but for an outlet tor their goods. Whether the outlets for cigars were profitable to every cigar manu facturer is a question that has no bearing upon the prices of leaf.

Some manufacturers have failed, and will fail, whether the cost of wrapper is tive cents or fifty cents a pound. In a cigar manufacturing business the cost of leaf is a secondary consideration; manipulation of the leaf, management of the business, and, above all, the art of ealculating the cost of a made up cigar (semething which the majority of the manufacturers are unable to do) constitute the main features of success in this business. Therefore the present cry that the old tobacco is too high and the new one still higher, and that it will be a hard task to dispose of it is all bosh. It will be well for those contemplating early purchases of '81 stock to pay no attention whatever to reports as to the quality and looks of this or that crop, but judge for themselves by actual examination. Reports, whether they originate with parties resident in the particular tobacco growing sections, boozy country newspaper reporters, or preambulating leaf brokers in our market, are in the main very unreliable. The opinions of packers in this respect are still more worthless. The sales of the week comprise but about 900 cases, of which 300 were '81 Pennsylvania, balance small parcels of other crops.
