Colored Glass. Colors are usually imparted to glass in the melting-pot; for blue, oxide of cobalt is used; for red or gold, sub-oxide of copper. Glass is stained by painting its surface with a fusible colored glass ground to a fine powder and mixed up with gum-water or turpentine, and, after drying, then heating the painted glass in a furnace until the coating fuses. Colloidum snellae, or spirit-colour varnish, properly colored with one of the color-far, can in some cases be advantageously employed as a colored wash for white glass.

A Sandwich Island Millionaire. The richest person upon the Sandwich Islands is Claus Spreckels, of Honolulu. A few years ago he was lauded as when he purchased 10,000 acres of land for 10 cents an acre, as the tract was at the foot of an extinct volcano, and covered with a crust on the surface like a flagstone walk. He broke up this crust, mixed the dust with a small quantity of vegetable mould, thoroughly irrigated the soil, thus formed and planted sugar-cane. To-day he is a millionaire.

The Shoebuck Plant. In many parts of Asia there is a plant known as the "shoebuck," which, although it will not grow in our gardens, is not unknown in hot-houses. It possesses brilliant scarlet flowers, which yield a thick, gummy juice, which gives a varnish-like polish to anything to which it may be applied; hence, its use as a substitute for blacking on shoes.
