LONDON, Dec. 20.—The Times in an editorial article this morning, considers that Guiteau was induced to allow a cast of his head to be taken by judicious flattery and says: "Nothing in criminal procedure has ever equalled the laxity of his trial."

ARTIC EXPLORES RESCUED. Discovery of a Vessel in the Polar Region said to have been lost since 1877.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—Reuter's telegram company has received the following dispatch: ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 20.—Lieut. Gen. Anotchine, governor general of Eastern Siberia, who has just arrived here, has brought the news that a steamer of the North America polar expedition, which had been lost since 1877, has been discovered and that assistance has been rendered to the crew.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—A telegram from St. Petersburg is published here which says it is believed in that city that the information brought by the governor of Eastern Siberia of the discovery of a steamer in the Arctic regions to the Jeannette. The despatch adds that the crew had suffered no loss.

KILLED BY THE CARS. The Steaming Death of a Young Farmer. MONTGOMERY, N. Y., Dec. 20.—W. H. Farley, a young and prominent farmer, residing near Coopers, went last evening to the depot with his wife, who was to take the Middletown way express train to Hampton. On his return home, while crossing the track near Otter Hill, he was struck by the train he was waiting for and instantly killed, the whole top of his head being cut off.

FOUND DEAD BY HIS SON. EASTON, Pa., Dec. 20.—Aaron Riegel, a farmer of Warren county, N. J., was found dead this morning in a cut on the D. & W. R. R. near Washington, 1 1/2 miles from Easton, while walking on the track. The remains were found by a son of deceased this morning.

THE WILL OF JOHN W. FORNEY. PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 20.—The will of the late Col. Forney was admitted to probate today. There are no public bequests. The executors are instructed to endeavor to secure repayment of moneys paid by Colonel Forney while holding the office of secretary of the Senate on account of the defalcation of one of his subordinates. It is stated that the amount of money Col. Forney made good to the government as heretofore stated was about \$49,000.

A New Daily Paper for Wilmington. WILMINGTON, Del., Dec. 20.—Messrs. Henderson & Sperry, the former at one time connected with the New York Evening Post, have purchased the Silver building, on Market street above Fifth, and will soon start another morning daily in this city.
