Cultivation of Sponges. A successful attempt at sponge cultiva tion is now being conducted at Pine Key, Florida. Mortality from Snakes and Tigers. No fewer than 21,990 persons were killed in India during the year 1880 by snakes and tigers. It is eminently unsatisfactory to hear that this loss of life, instead of decreasing with the advance of civilization, has actually increased during the past five years. This statement appears almost incredible, and requires explanation. The largest fatality from snakes and wild beasts occur in the Bengal presidency, where during last year 10,064 bites, and 359 to have been killed by tigers. It appears from the weekly returns issued by the sanitary commissioner of the Punjab, that during the fortnight ending August 27 last, no fewer than 113 deaths resutted from snake bites in fiftytwo of the largest cities of that provinceequal to nearly 3,000 per annum. The fatality from this cause is larger in tho rural than in the town districts.
