THE GREAT SHOW TO CLOSE TO-NIGHT.

The third annual exhibition of the Lancaster Poultry Association, which opened in Excelsior hall last Thursday, will close this evening. It has been attended by a far larger number of visitors than either of the preceding shows given under the auspices of the society. Those who have not yet taken a look at the fine collection of fowls on exhibition should do so this evening.
