THE TOBACCO MARKET.

SEED LEAF AND HAVANA.

For the Week Ending Saturday, January 28, 10 a. m.

U. S. Tobacco Journal. A sale of 1,000 cases of '80 Wisconsin was the leading feature of our market. The demand for goods has somewhat increased, though only in low and medium priced goods. The continued quietude in manufacturing circles is the main cause of the stagnation in the leaf trade, though the high prices of leaf in general also have considerable influence in this direction. The leaf market is easily discouraged by even a short period of inactivity, and fears of a coming break-down in prices are largely entertained; a glaring contrast to such disposition is the sanguine, rushing and over-reaching way in which this trade indulges whenever a spell of activity sets in. For the trade there is neither cause for any depression nor great elevation of spirits. The agitation regarding the reduction or total abolition of the cigar tax will, if not settled soon, certainly have some influence upon the cigar manufacturing industry, and restricted orders by jobbers will be the consequence. Nevertheless, stocks of cigars are very small, and the consumption is increasing, and therefore the agitation cannot cause a very serious interruption. The certainty that the '81 crop contains but a limited amount of fine goods is a safeguard against losses by investors in fine '81 tobaccos. For cheap goods the market is an open
