RELIGIOUS FACIONS AT WAR.

A Union Church at Coplay, Lehigh County, Pa. The church difficulty, not unlike that which took place at Balltown's church, Berks county, last year, occurred at Coplay, Lehigh county, Sunday afternoon, for the past nine years the Lutheran and Reformed congregations of Coplay have been worshipping in one church, but not until yesterday was there any breach of the peace or interruption to the harmony that has prevailed. The church has heretofore by common consent been regarded as a union church, and the Lutheran and Reformed congregations worshipped therein on alternate Sundays. In 1873 the Lehigh Valley iron company donated a lot of ground and \$2,000 towards the erection of the church, and B. S. Lavan, then president of the iron company and a wealthy man, contributed \$1,500 toward the church, with the idea that it was to be a union church. The members of the denominations together contributed \$4,500, and the erection of the church was commenced. The members of the two organizations dug the cellar, laid the foundation walls and together did all the work peacefully and harmoniously. In due time the church was dedicated. During the past four weeks, however, there have been indications that trouble was impending, the leaders of the Reformed congregation claiming that their organization owned the building. Nothing serious was thought of these rumors until the Lutherans had little heed to them. When, however, Rev. J. D. Stimmel, the Lutheran pastor, and his congregation had assembled they found the doors locked, and as a consequence no services were held. The affair has created great excitement and is still the absorbing topic of gossip. Mr. Stimmel advised his people to go home peacefully and indulge in no unseemly conduct. The paper presented to the Lutherans asking for subscriptions to build the church set forth that the structure was designed to be a union church and no attempt would be made to consider the matter was secured. To this fact the Lutherans are ready to testify in court, where the matter no doubt will be brought for a verdict. The leaders of the locked-out movement say that the paper which set forth that the building was to be a union church was a forgery. The excitement yesterday ran high and several women were so much agitated that they cried bitterly. Several members of the Reformed denomination do not approve of the locking out and one of the elders has resigned.

The Finance Committee of the City of Lancaster respectfully submit the following report in compliance with the Act of April 20, 1874, showing the financial condition of the City of Lancaster, on the 31st day of January, A. D. 1882:

The funded debt as above matures in 1885, 1890 and 1891 and at intermediate periods at the option of the city. In fixing valuation of real estate the committee are of opinion that valuation is lower than the properties would bring if put upon the market. The city pays nothing for the use of water. The Fire Department and other purposes through 1881, 1882, 1883, 1884, 1885, 1886, 1887, 1888, 1889, 1890, 1891 and 1892, and is estimated at \$100,000.00.
