Court of Common Pleas.

BEFORE JUDGE LIVINGSTON :

Dr. Thomas B. Cox vs. Henry Kraber, administrator c. t. a. of Margaret Bier, deceased. This is an action to recover \$926.60 pay for medical services rendered the deceased by the plaintiff during her lifetime. Miss Bier for many years resided on South Queen street and was always in delicate health. She diod in May, 1881, at the advanced age of 80 years. The plaintiff occupied a portion of her house as an office and was her phy sician. He attended her from August, 1879, to May, 1881, especially in the latter year, when he visited her daily, and claims that he was not paid. To recover the money this suit is brought.

The defense is that the plaintiff's bill is too high by far, and it is claimed that he did not make as many visits as he claims on professional business, but that he often dropped in to see the deceased to chat with her and then charged for it ; that a settlement was had between them up to November, 1880, since which time only they admit they owe him for professional services.
