THE SEASON OF LENT. Rules to be observed during that period. The following circular letter has been issued, containing instructions for fasting during Lent, which commences February 22d:

- 1. All the faithful who have completed their twenty-first year, unless infirmly or naturally dispensed, bound to observe the fast of Lent.
2. They are to make only one meal a day, except Sundays.
3. The meal allowed on fast days is not to be taken until after noon.
4. Flesh, meat and fish are not to be used at the same meal during Lent.
5. A small refreshment commonly called collation, is allowed in the evening, not to exceed the fourth part of an ordinary meal.
6. At the collation, it is permitted to use bread, all kinds of fruits, cakes and vegetables. The use of butter, cheese, milk and eggs is also tolerated by virtue of long established custom.
7. General usage has made it lawful to take in the morning some warm liquid, as tea, coffee or chocolate made with water and a mouthful of bread.
8. Necessity and custom have authorized the use of hog's lard instead of butter in preparing permitted food.
9. The following persons are exempted from the obligations of fasting: Persons under twenty-one years of age, the sick, nursing women, those who are obliged to do hard labor, all who, through weakness, cannot fast without great prejudice to their health.
10. By dispensation the use of fresh meat will be allowed on all meals on Sunday, and once a day on Mondays, Tuesdays and Saturdays of Lent.
11. The faithful are reminded that, besides the obligations of fasting imposed by the church, this holy season of Lent should be employed in pious exercises, of earnest prayer, of sorrow for sin, of ascension from the world and its amusements, and of generous almsgiving.
12. The paschal time extends from the first Sunday of Lent till Trinity Sunday, during which time all Catholics who have attained the use of reason are bound to prepare themselves to receive worthily the holy communion. The holy season of Lent is a very proper time, also for children to go to their first confession, which they ought to do generally when about seven years of age. Parents should see to this.
