The Latest Intelligence from Strasburg Borough—Matters around Georgetown and Festivities at Quarryville.

Mr. E. Bear, widow of Martin Bear, deceased, aged seventy-six years, seven months and two days, was buried at Strasburg cemetery on Saturday morning, March 18.

A number of young men in the borough are talking of organizing a boat club for the summer.

The first of April will bring with it many changes.

A number of experienced tobacco growers have made arrangements with Chester county farmers to cultivate tobacco for them, and will leave here soon.

On last Friday Martin & Fritz sold 110 cases of tobacco to Mr. John Moore & Co., of Philadelphia, on private terms, and in the evening Mr. Hart delivered a lecture on temperance to a small audience in the M. E. church.

The sale of tobacco appeared to attract more attention than Mr. Hart's lecture, but tobacco is a matter that is nearer the "hearts" or "pockets" of Hart's inhabitants than whisky or his demoralization.
