Most of the sales have been on private terms, but are said to be satisfactory. There were loaded at Quarryville on Saturday three full car loads, and every day last week more or less was shipped. Tobacco has been a paying freight on that road this season. Our Hird-in-Hand correspondent furnishes the following from that neighborhood: Mr. J. B. Thus far the spring has been so bleakward that farmers have done very little in preparing for the crop of 1892.
