

THE TOBACCO MARKET.

NEED LEAF AND HAVANA. For the Week Ending Saturday, April 8, 10 A. M. United States Tobacco Journal. There is a mystery somewhere. The leaf market remains exceedingly dull; the cigar manufacturers actually whine that business is inactive and now comes the report of the Second and Third New York revenue collection districts for the month of March, in which we observe a surprisingly large gain in collections from cigars compared with the previous month and also the month of March, 1881. It shows an increase of over eight million cigars. Inprobable as it will appear, there can be but the following solution of this strange exhibit: Manufacturers, wanting to avoid strikes, claim a continuous decline in business; they also keep away from the market in order not to incite too great rapacity on the part of the holders of new tobacco. We repeat these conclusions seem improbable, but who can make better ones? If in face of an unsettled question and tenement-house cigar manufacturing agitation and the deplorable condition of the South, such a large increase in revenue could take place, how great or enormous will be the increase when these questions are settled, which, as it appears, will be the case soon? The conclusion is forced upon one that the manufacture of cigars in this country during 1882 will be far ahead of that of the previous years, and that consequently packers of suitable leaf will make fine profits on their investments. The sales of the week were as follows: Pennsylvania—Crop '80; 300 cases; low and medium running, 10 to 15 cents; wrappers, 28 to 40 cents. Connecticut—Crop '80; 200 cases wrappers, 30 to 45 cents. Ohio—Crop '80; 700 cases, mostly for export, at 4 1/2 to 6 cents. Havana—Active. Sales 1,400 bales, mostly '81 Remedies, at 8 1/2 cents to 1 1/2 in vegas. Tobacco Taxes. The cigarette manufacturers want their tax reduced to fifty cents per thousand, and have this week sent a good representative to Washington to tell the committee on ways and means so. The national manufacturers' association, of this city, have decided not to urge Congress to reduce the cigar tax to four dollars per thousand, but only to request that the question of the tax be speedily settled. Recent movements in Congress have impressed many persons with the idea that the tobacco tax question will be revived before the close of the present session. This idea ought to be dismissed as unfounded at once. Gane's Report. Sales of seed leaf tobacco reported by J. S.
