SHIPPER'S STORY.

What the Witness Understood From Secretary Blaine's Marginal Note to Minister Harbit, "Go in, Steve."

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 14.—The Shipper investigation was continued this morning. Witness said the subject of the war with Chili was never discussed with Blaine or Blair.

Witness declined to say what he meant by the statement that "He was awaiting whatever course Mr. Blaine might pursue when he (Shipper) might have something to say."

Witness declined to state what passed between him and President Arthur when he presented Gen. Grant's letter of introduction. The conversation had relation to the Peruvian company, but what relation witness refused to state.

Witness's impression as to the meaning of the marginal note "Go in, Steve" was that the wishes of the department were that Harbit should go on in the course he was pursuing, regardless of the text of the dispatch.

Witness declined to state whether the draft of instructions which General Grant endorsed had any allusions to the possibility of a war with Chili.

Witness stated he had never received any correspondence from Blaine and all his correspondence with the secretary has been published.

Witness's further examination was postponed until to-morrow.

SCARLET FEVER. A Malignant Type Raging in Berks County. PHILADELPHIA, April 14.—With regard to alarming rumors of an epidemic of scarlet fever in Berks county a special dispatch from Allentown this morning says:

Since January last a malignant form of scarlet fever has been raging in Boyertown, situated in the lower end of Berks county, with a population of over 2,000.

For a few weeks there was an average of two or three deaths daily in the town. The disease is generally confined to children, but quite a number of grown persons have been afflicted with fatal results.

In most cases death follows within a few days after the appearance of the first symptoms. The physicians seem to be unable to cope with the disease.

The cause of the disease is a mystery as the writer is very poor and Boyertown has always heretofore been an unusually healthy place. The authorities are now at a loss to know what to do, as they have already applied nearly everything that is generally conducive to checking the disease.

It is estimated that since the first appearance of scarlet fever there have been over 100 deaths in the borough and immediate vicinity.

FIRE RECORD. Lunatic Asylum Burned Near Austin, Texas. GALVESTON, Texas, April 14.—A special dispatch from Austin this morning says: One of the buildings of the lunatic asylum situated two miles and a half from this town, was burned yesterday.

The building was a one story brick structure and cost \$12,000.

See bills started by incendiaries. PHILADELPHIA, Pa., April 14.—The saw mills of Herbert Thomas, at Chase, Lake county, were totally destroyed by fire.

The night watchman claims that he was confronted by three masked men, two of whom held him while the third fired the mill. Loss, \$30,000; partially insured.

Disastrous flames at Lebanon Mo. LEBANON, Mo., April 14.—A fire last night destroyed a whole block of business houses here involving a loss of \$60,000.

The principal losers are W. A. Spillar, \$20,000, insurance \$10,000; and C. T. Walter, \$40,000, insurance \$20,000. The other losses range from \$500 to \$5,500.

THE NARROW ESCAPE OF A CANADIAN PRELUDING OFFICER. QUEBEC, April 14.—The Quebec government was only sustained by the casting vote of the speaker in the legislative council last night in the division of the bill depriving the speaker of that body of a seat in the cabinet.

Mother and Child Burned at St. Louis. ST. LOUIS, April 14.—A fire early this morning destroyed a tenement house on 24th and Morgan streets, occupied by colored people. One girl, thirteen years old, was burned to death and her mother fatally injured. Several other tenants were more or less burned while effecting their escape from the building.

\$100,000 DAMAGES AWARDED. The Famous Hinman-Hare Suit Decided. NEW YORK, April 14.—In the suit for libel brought by the Rev. Samuel D. Hinman against Bishop W. H. Hare, the jury to-day rendered a verdict of \$100,000 for the plaintiff.

FELL 170 FEET. A Miners Terrible Death at Wilkesbarre. WILKESBARRE, April 14.—Daniel Truesdale was killed at the parish colliery last evening by falling down the shaft, a distance of 170 feet. The deceased was formerly of Linwood, Kansas.

Providence, April 14.—The Greenville woolen company's mills in Smithfield, was burned last night, together with fine tenement block. Total loss, \$75,000, partially insured. The occupants of the tenement block saved the best of their effects.

NEW JERSEY'S RAILROAD. An Order for Election of Officers. NEWARK, N. J., April 14.—Governor Rutgers granted an order to-day permitting the directors of the Central railroad of New Jersey to take the necessary steps for the election of directors by the stockholders of the company. The application was made by A. C. Barker, Trenton, and James E. Gowen, of Philadelphia, a large stockholder. The application was not tested by counsel for the railroad, but the order was made by mutual agreement between counsel.

ENGLAND AND MEXICO. Diplomatic Relations to be Resumed. CITY OF MEXICO, April 14.—Negotiations are in progress between Mexico and England, looking toward the opening of diplomatic relations. This government is favorably disposed thereto.
