A cloud of melancholy hovers over our leaf market. No stir, no excitement, no buyers and even but few sellers. Notwithstanding the dullness of trade in leaf, for the past few months stocks have continued to get smaller and beautifully less by degrees. A correct computation of the stocks of leaf tobacco in our market is impossible, but a general estimate will hardly yield an exhibit of over 20,000 cases. Of these there are about 6,000 New York state, 8,000 Pennsylvania, 3,000 Connecticut and 2,000 Ohio and Wisconsin. Even if there should be a continuation of comparative inactivity during the next three mouths the natural consumption will almost clear our market of old

Immediately upon the settlement of the tax and tenement-house cigar manufactur-ing questions, the manufacturers of cigars will, it is safe to say, leap into a prosperity far greater than any records of the past show. The stock of cigars on hand all over the country has dwindled down to very small proportions. The consumption of eigars has and is increasing daily. Stocks of leaf in hands of manufacturers are small also. Consequently the outlook for the leaf market is exceedingly bright, and packers of most of the '81 tobaccos are counting their unhatched chickens with admirable coolness. Nothing can shake the expectations of packers of '81 Wisconsin that their stock will be in the lead and throw every manufacturer who merely glances at the samples into a state of absolute bewilderment, admiration and enthusiasm. Packers of '81 Pennsylvania are seriously contemplating the widening of their store entrances, so as to avoid in-juries to the lives and limbs of the manufacturers who they believe will rush upon them in crowds. There are also packers of the '81 New York state who cannot believe otherwise than that their stock is worth its weight in gold.

Positive it is that all of these three crops contain a certain amount of leaf than which none better ever was raised in this country. Holders of '81 Connecticut preserve an air of indifference. They are sure of the sale of their stock whether business is good or bad. Connecticut is Connecticut, and as long as it has not too great an amount of white veins and it is not too light in color, its old patrons will take it, even if Pennsylvania, Wisconsin and state are wonderful in all respects. From packers of '81 Ohio, also, no great boasts are being heard. Perhaps their "Cinderella" will be queen this year. Who can tell? The sales of leaf in our market during

the past week were as follows: New England-Crop '81: 300 cases, mostly wrappers, 25 to 40 cents. Pennsylvania-Crop '81: 200 cases,

wrappers, 30 to 35 cents.
Ohio—Crop '81: 900 cases, partly for export, 41 to 91 cents. Havana-Market active. Sales 1,000 bales, nearly all Remedios. Prices firm.

The market has been very quiet for a week. The demand for low grade old tobacco continues, but there have not been many sales—the whole probably aggregating less than 200 cases, and these on private terms. Holders of old tebacco, which is getting scarce, appear to think there will be a rise in prices and refuse to entertain offers except they be very good ones. They have also confidence that their purchases of new tobacco even at the prices paid, will turn out well, and this confidence is increased by the avidity with which more tardy buyers are now picking up what is left of the crop of

As yet nothing of any account has been done towards the preparation of the ground for the coming crop. Reports from the country are to the effect that though some seed beds were ruined by the late freeze, most of them escaped injury, being well protected by capyag or other being well protected by canvas or other covering. A few farmers have plowed their ground, but most of them are waiting for milder and more favorable weather than has yet prevailed.
